

JSEA Schools

- 59 high schools across the United States and Canada
- 21 are coeducational
- 1 is co-divisional
- 10 are Cristo Rey model schools
- 1 is a boarding school
- 7 have middle school grades
- 3 are co-sponsored
- The oldest school opened in 1789, the newest in 2009

Students and Faculty

- 49,836 students were enrolled for the 2009-2010 school year.

JSEA Services

Ignatian Leadership Formations

- National meetings of 17 different role member groupings every 2- 4 years (**academic assist. principals, admission, advancement/alumni, athletic directors, campus ministers, deans of students, diversity, counselors, librarians and media specialists, presidents, principals, religious ed., school business and finance, service program directors, technology coordinators, trustees, ?**)
- Seminars in Ignatian leadership (four seminars conducted in a three year cycle)
- Symposium, Colloquium, and Ignatian Leadership Academy meet every three years on a rotating basis, focus on Ignatian education in curriculum design and review, special topics, and faculty development through an Ignatian lens

Website

- Resource library with hundreds of documents and presentations
- Online community - a place for exchanging of ideas and discussions, prayer requests, and special member areas for people of similar jobs

Research Surveys

- Student Profile Survey (SPS) measures the growth of the students in Ignatian values over their time in high school
- Ignatian School Identity Survey (ISIS) measures Ignatian identity of a school from view of various constituents

- 27.26% of the enrolled students identify themselves as a minority
- Of the 10,700 seniors who graduated last academic year 98% went straight on to college, 20% of them choose to attend a Jesuit institution
- 6,331 faculty and staff serve in our schools, 4% are Jesuit

Tuition and Financial Aid

- Tuition and fees for our member schools ranges from \$100-27,100. The median cost being \$11,119.
- For the 09-10 school year \$75,142,401 was distributed as financial aid among 14,075 students or 28% of those enrolled. The median aid per student was \$5,339

- Administrative Leadership Profile Survey (ALPS) examines top administrators Ignatian leadership

Publishing

- Monthly bulletin of important issues
- MAGISine an annual publication for in depth treatment of Ignatian topics
- System wide data reports on special topics that help assist schools in decision making

Networking

- Act as a liaison between the schools and the Society of Jesus on an international level
